CERTIFICATE OF ORDINANCE

I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that I am the duly appointed, qualified and acting Village Clerk of the Village of Mackinaw, Tazewell County, Illinois (the "Issuer"), and as such official I am the keeper of the records and files of its President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities").

I do further certify the foregoing constitutes a full, true and complete excerpt from the proceedings of the regular meeting of the Corporate Authorities held on the 13TH day of June 2017, insofar as same relates to the adoption of Ordinance No. 941, entitled:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF MACKINAW, TAZEWELL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, ASCERTAINING THE PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKMEN AND MECHANICS EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS OF SAID VILLAGE

A true, correct and complete copy of which ordinance (the "Preliminary Ordinance" or "Ordinance") as adopted at such meeting appears in the transcript of the minutes of such meeting. The Preliminary Ordinance was adopted and approved by the vote and on the date therein set forth.

I do further certify the deliberations of the Corporate Authorities on the adoption of such Preliminary Ordinance were taken openly and was on the agenda at least 48 hours before the meeting at which it was adopted, that the adoption of such ordinance was duly moved and seconded, that the vote on the adoption of such ordinance was taken openly and was preceded by a public recital of the nature of the matter being considered and such other information as would inform the public of the business being conducted, that such meeting was held at a specified time and place convenient to the public, that notice of such meeting was duly given to all of the news media requesting such notice, that such meeting was called and held in strict compliance with the provisions of the Open Meetings Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, and the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended, and that the Corporate Authorities have compiled with all of the applicable provisions of such Act and such Code and their procedural rules in the adoption of such ordinance.

The pamphlet form of *Ordinance No.941*, including the ordinance and a cover sheet thereof, was prepared and a copy of such Ordinance was posted for public inspection in the municipal building, the Mackinaw United States Post Office, and the Mackinaw Library commencing on *JUNE 13*, 2017 and continuing for at least ten days thereafter. The original ordinance was adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw at a regular meeting, attended by **five** members of the Board, and approved by the President, as said Ordinance appears on file in my office and as the same is recorded in the Book of Ordinances of said Village.

ORDINANCE NO. 941

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF MACKINAW, TAZEWELL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, ASCERTAINING THE PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKMEN AND MECHANICS EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS OF SAID VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq., and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Mackinaw investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Mackinaw employed in performing construction of public works, for said Village of Mackinaw.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MACKINAW, TAZEWELL COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Mackinaw is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Tazewell County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 2017. A copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June 2017 determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Mackinaw. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works and landscaping construction of the Village of Mackinaw to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Mackinaw Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village of Mackinaw this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Mackinaw Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Mackinaw Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this ordinance with the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Mackinaw Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area of a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

ASBESTOS - See Laborers

CARPENTERS (NORTH) - That part of the county North including the towns of Marquette Hts., Morton, Creve Coeur and Deer Creek.

LABORERS (NORTHWEST) - The area bounded by the old city limits of East Peoria.

MILLWRIGHTS - See Carpenters

PILEDRIVERS - See Carpenters

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the

appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - Removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment

purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air

compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by

separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes.

Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more.

Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while

employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

F.W.D. & Similar Types; Vermeer Concrete Saw. {industrial or Farm-type w/Dozer-Hoe-Endloader or other attachments}; similar types; Screed Man on Laydown Machine; Wheel Tractors Operator will clean; Formless Finishing Machine; Flaherty Spreader or Crete-Squeeze Cretes-Screw-type Pumps and Gypsum; Bulker & Pump types) Motor Patrol; Power Blades - Dumore - Elevating and similar Earth Movers; Creter Crane; Trench Machine; Pump-crete-Belt Paver; Rock Crusher; Heavy Equipment Greaser; CMI, CMI Belt Placer, Pushcats; Endloaders (all types); Asphalt Surfacing Machine; Slip Form Engineers; 3 Drum Hoist; Derricks; Hydro Cranes; Shovels; Skimmer Auto Grade & 3 Track and similar types; Side Booms; Multiple Unit Helicopter; Tournapulls - all and similar types; Scoops (all sizes); Caisson Rigs; Dozer; Tournadozer; Work Boats; Ross Carrier; Backfiller; Drott Yumbo and similar types considered as Cranes; types; Tower Cranes (Crawler-Mobile) and Stationary; Crane-type Drivers and Skid Rigs; Clamshells; Locomotive Cranes; Dredge (all Scoops; Koehring Scooper; Drag Lines; Backhoe; Derrick Boats; Pile Dual Drum - Tri Batchers); Blacktop Plant Operators and Plant Spray Machine on Paving; Curb Machines; Truck Crane Oilers; Oil Porter Rex Rail; Clary Screed; Truck Type Hoptoe Oilers; Fireman; over 3 Bag to 27E; Tractor pulling Power Blade or Elevating Grader; Self-propelled; Winch or Boom Truck; Mechanical Bull Floats; Mixers Green or similar loaders; Vibro Tamper (All similar types) Blower; Hydro Seeder; Assistant Heavy Equipment Greaser on Spread; Texture & Reel Curing Machines; Cement Finishing Machine; Barber Pulling Rollers; Center Stripper; Cement Finishing Machines & CMI Asphalt - Brick Macadem; Concrete Breakers; Concrete Spreaders; Mule Tractors (Track type) without Power Unit pulling Rollers; Rollers on Machine & Pipe Jacking Machine; Hydro Boom; Dewatering System; Straw Drum Hoists (Buck Hoist and Similar Types); Chicago Boom; Boring Testing) and similar types; Gurries and Similar Types; (1) and (2) Automatic Cement and Gravel Batching Plants; Mobile Drills (Soil Forklifts; Jeeps w/Ditching Machine or other attachments; Tuneluger; (and similar types); Pugmill with Pump; Backfillers; Euclid Loader; Class 2. Dinkeys; Power Launches; PH One-pass Soil Cement Machine

Distributor; Truck-Mounted Saws.

Class 3. Air Compressor; Power Subgrader; Straight Tractor; Trac Air without attachments; Herman Nelson Heater, Dravo, Warner, Silent Glo, and similar types; Roller: Five (5) Ton and under on Earth or Gravel; Form Grader; Crawler Crane & Skid Rig Oilers; Freight Elevators - permanently installed; Pump; Light Plant; Generator; Conveyor (1) or (2) - Operator will clean; Welding Machine; Mixer (3) Bag and Under (Standard Capacity with skip); Bulk Cement Plant; Oiler on Central Concrete Mixing Plant.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

CLASS 1. Cranes; Hydro Cranes; Shovels; Crane Type Backfiller; Tower, Mobile, Crawler, & Stationary Cranes; Derricks; Hoists (3 Drum);

Draglines; Drott Yumbo & Similar Types considered as Cranes; 360

Degree Swing Excavator (Shears, Grapples, Movacs, etc.); Back Hoe;

operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
